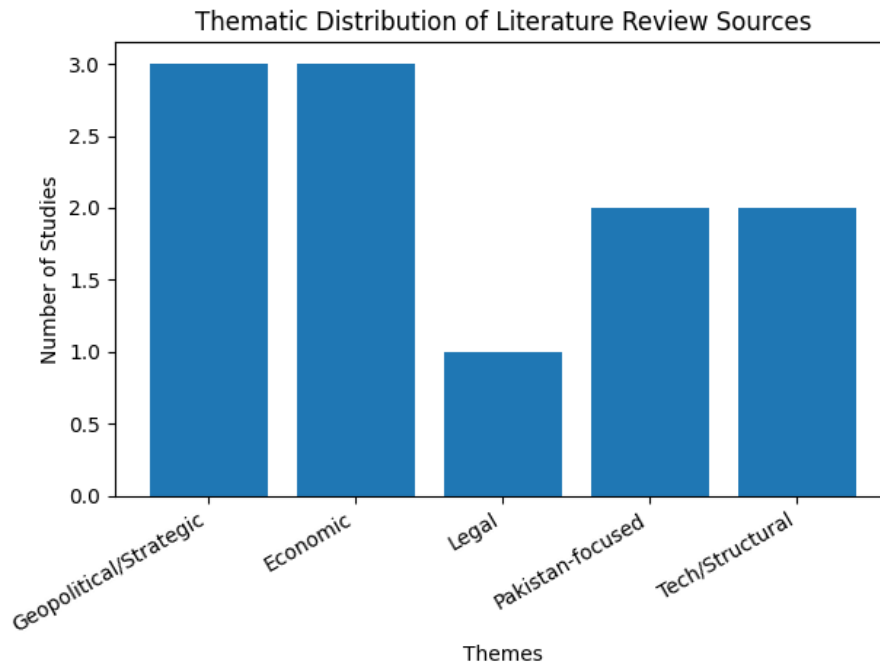
### **2.4 Regional Relations and Pakistan, Iran Dynamics**
